

P-1 Vintage PinCushion \$15

A paper pattern with instructions and color photos. An original pattern dedicated to and designed by Mary Fisher (1908-2006) of Indian Springs, NV. Her design was cleverly created to be used over a broken candlestick. Pattern has been modified to use an intact candlestick at least 6" tall. Pattern is ideal to separate various needles and pins into readily identifiable categories using the segments. To identify segments, stamp metal disks with the category names and a hole at the top for attaching.

Materials:

$\frac{1}{4}$ yd. fabric (Suggested fabrics: velveteen, bottom weight cotton or upholstery fabric. ---
Napped fabric requires $\frac{1}{3}$ yd.

Candlestick (Must be at least 6 inches tall, of substantial weight, with a top approximately 2" in diameter and a bottom that will be stable once pin cushion is added.)

Thread to match fabric

Heavy weight nylon thread

Wooden disk (no more than $\frac{1}{4}$ " larger than candlestick top)

Clear, fast drying glue

Fiberfill stuffing

Tissue paper

Embellishments, as desired

Tools

Compass

Scissors

Tape Measure

Pencil

Sewing Machine

Needles

Pins
